Part-Time Study

Morling College is committed to offering flexible delivery of courses tailored to your needs and your schedule. Our on-campus classes are held both during day time and evenings, with a focus for people to experience community through weekly chapel services, prayer triplets and community lunches. We also offer some courses and units by Distance Education, and it is possible to mix on-campus study and Distance Education. Intensive courses are also available for part-time students, these are listed on Page 7 of this booklet.

Part-time students at Morling study one or two subjects (“units”) per semester. There are two semesters in a year and units are usually one semester long. Each unit typically requires one three-hour lecture per week during the thirteen teaching weeks of a semester. Units are usually studied towards a Degree, Diploma, Graduate Diploma and Masters offered by the Australian College of Theology (ACT).

Morling College: An Accredited College

Morling College is an affiliated institution with the Australian College of Theology (*CRICOS Provider 02650E*). Morling College carries its own government accreditation for Counselling (*CRICOS Provider 03265F*) and Teacher Education.

Morling After Six

Part-time students who attend evening classes will enjoy *Morling After Six*, a community-building initiative for those who cannot participate in daytime events at College. Together with full-time students attending evening classes, part-time students will have the opportunity to get to know one another and the Morling faculty through a common lecture break. While enjoying a cup of tea or coffee with supper in the quadrangle, students will be able to partner with others in fellowship and prayer.

Are you coming straight from work? Take advantage of our Dining Hall and Common Room facilities. If you are able to come to dinner at 6pm in the Dining Hall you are more than welcome. A small meal cost is involved for dinner and can be charged to your student account. Lounge and dining facilities are available to part-time students in the student Common Room located next to the Dining Hall.

Guided Spiritual Formation

Morling College is committed to transformational discipleship and ongoing personal development. Guided Spiritual Formation (GSF) is a compulsory unit in the Advanced Diploma and Bachelor of Ministry Awards. It is equal to a full unit, but is broken into four quarters (one credit point per semester). New Bachelor of Ministry and Advanced Diploma of Ministry students should enrol in the first quarter of GSF along with any other chosen units. Students in other Awards may also do GSF. There is more information in the *Supplement to the Prospectus*. Please contact the college if you would like a copy sent to you. Guided Spiritual Formation can also be done by distance study.



Course Advising & Support

All students at Morling College are encouraged to seek academic advice and support throughout their studies. Students can discuss essays and assignments with their lecturers or with Gayle Kent, the Dean of Students. Morling College 2012 Tuition Fees

Audit (at Undergraduate level): \$400.00 per Unit (only attendance at lectures, no assessment).

Internal unit: \$850.00 per Unit (subject taken for Internal Award) (attendance at lecture & assessment completion).

ACT (Advanced) Diploma: \$850.00 per Unit

ACT Bachelor Degree: \$1,220.00 per Unit

ACT Graduate Diploma and Masters (Divinity): \$1,300.00 per Unit

*Overseas Students: \$1,300.00 per Unit at Undergraduate level.

Morling College charges no additional fees; all our fees are heavily subsidised and therefore considerably less than the ACT scheduled fees. By God's provision we offer quality education at what we believe a fair and reasonable rate.

Fee-Help

The Government has introduced a HECS-style government loan scheme known as FEE-HELP to assist Australians fund their theological education through paying an eligible student's tuition fees; Morling College students enrolled in Australian College of Theology (ACT) courses may be eligible. For more information go to www.goingtouni.gov.au. Eligible students attending Morling College will be able to access a loan up to \$86,422.00 (2011 Figure) for the course they are undertaking. This loan will then be repaid through the taxation system once the student's taxable income is above a certain threshold. This income threshold is \$44,911.00 per annum for the 2010-2011 income year. The threshold rises as the CPI increases.

The Government will charge a 25% loan fee on FEE-HELP for undergraduate courses; however, there is no loan fee for units of study in graduate or postgraduate courses.

- * Graduate Certificate/ Diploma of Divinity/Christian Studies & Master of Divinity/Christian Studies
- * Graduate Diploma of Ministry/Theology & Master of Arts in Ministry/Theology
- * Master of Theology
- * Doctor of Ministry/Theology

The following awards taught by Morling College ARE NOW eligible for FEE-HELP:

- * Graduate Certificate/Diploma of Counselling (*Accredited by NSW DET*)
- * Master of Counselling (*Accredited by NSW DET*)

The following awards taught by Morling College are not eligible for FEE-HELP:

- * Certificate in Theology (ACT)
- * Certificate in Biblical Studies (Internal)
- * Graduate in Christian Ministries (Three-year, Internal)
- * Graduate in Christian Ministries Advanced (Four-year, Internal). For more information go to www.goingtouni.gov.au

How to Enrol (Part-Time students)

Please see attached enrolment form at the back of this booklet. Alternatively you download a form from our website www.morlingcollege.com

When you enrol in one of the ACT Awards (Bachelor of Theology, Bachelor of Ministry, Diploma of Ministry, etc.) you must enrol in both Morling College and the ACT. Your enrolment form will include the ACT enrolment form and you must record your Unit choices on both forms. If you wish to enrol in one of the Morling College Internal Awards, then the ACT form is not necessary.

If English is not your first language, we will assist you with your application. We do require evidence of some tertiary study completed in English or your result in an IELTS test (Academic).

Certificate in Theology enrolments: we recommend that this award be done for ACT credit. Please contact us at enquiries@morling.com.au for forms and information on any of our courses.

Withdrawal/Variation Policy for 2012

Students may vary their unit selection or drop a unit without a Variation of Enrolment Fee until the Administration Date, and receive either a full refund or reversal of FEE-HELP.

Enrolment variations (addition or substitution of units) between the Administration Date and Census Date incur a fee of \$110 per unit added or substituted. A unit dropped receives a full refund (or FEE-HELP reversal) but incurs a \$340 Administration fee.

Students should ensure that no substitutions or additions are made after Census Date. If a unit is dropped after the Census Date, there is no Variation of Enrolment Fee, but the student will not receive a refund nor a reversal of FEE-HELP debt incurred. The subject is graded "W" and receives no academic penalty.

Withdrawing from a unit after the Withdrawal Date receives no refund or FEE-HELP reversal and is penalised academically with a grade of "FW" (Fail Withdrawal). Refer to Page 5 for key dates.

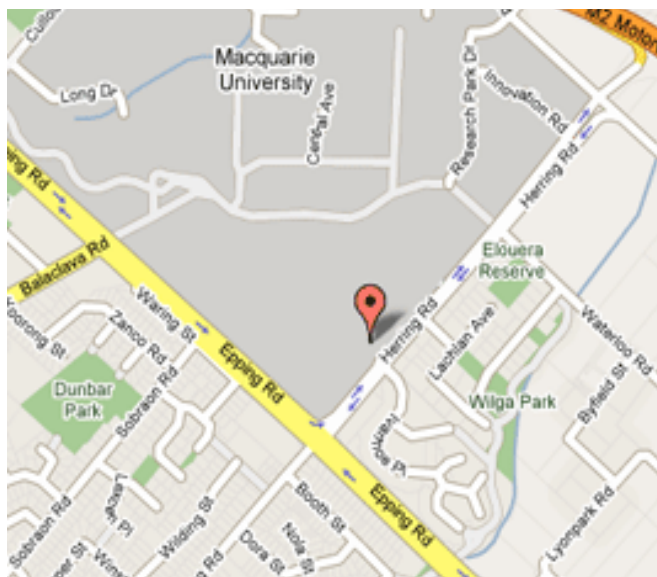
