In this subject you will engage in this process, using Genesis 1-3 as the basis for developing your awareness of the practical and theoretical issues involved.

This subject will help you not only explore these issues but also shape your response on the basis of the biblical imperatives that speak to our understanding of teaching and learning.

Do you have a heart for the poor and those without a voice in this

This subject will examine biblical teaching regarding wealth creation and stewardship; explore reasons for the continuation of poverty; find biblical principles of justice, compassion and holism and their implications for the work and mission of the local church; and investigate contemporary examples of the church's response to the ongoing oppression and needs of the poor.

Intensive 31/8-4/9

MA level

This subject is for those seeking to enhance their effectiveness in ministry through developing understanding of the dynamics of the leadership development process. Students will learn to find their own personal development patterns and gain tools for better understanding of personality types in order to better recruit, team build, counsel, manage conflict and understand interpersonal dynamics.

Local Church & Global Mission - Mike Frost



31/7; 28/8; 25/9; 23/10; 6/11 **DMin or Masters level**

This course will explore the major global issues that confront the church today - globalisation, climate change, religious conflict, terrorism, global poverty - in order to develop a biblical perspective on the role of the people of God in the world. We will also seek to develop and evaluate the responses of the Christian church during last century to these issues in light of the biblical mandate, and consider the place of cross cultural mission within the total global ministry of the church. Finally, we will create a broad range of practical steps that a local church can implement in order to develop a global vision and an effective involvement in the missionary task.

Biblical & Ministry Perspectives on Prayer - John Reid & Andrew Sloane

This subject aims to guide students in understanding the critical issues concerning prayer in the Bible. Students will examine in detail one major issue concerning prayer from a biblical perspective, and will reflect critically on the significance of prayer in Christian life and ministry. It will give you the skills and knowledge to seek a deeper prayer life for yourself and to teach others as you establish communities of prayer through your ministry.

Theology, Culture and the Mission of the Church - John & Olive Drane

Intensive 9/11-13/11

DMin or Masters level

This subject will help you understand contemporary Western culture with its challenges and opportunities for effective Christian ministry and mission. You will explore contextualisation of the Gospel today through the renewal of personal spirituality and church life, in ways that are relevant to the emerging culture as well as biblical and Christian traditions. You will consider the relationship between spirituality and the arts, and the impact of New Spirituality on Christian faith and practice.

Both John and Olive are lecturers at Fuller Theological Seminary, USA. John is author of the best-selling *The McDonaldization of the Church* as well as introductions to the Old & New Testaments; and is Chairperson of Mission Theology Advisory Group of the Archbishops' Council of the Church of England. Olive is author of *Clowns, Storytellers, Disciples and Spirituality to Go*; and is mission consultant for Baptist Union of Scotland.



NT Theology & its Contemporary Implications - Brian Powell

This subject will confront you with the current features and issues in approaches to New Testament theology, with a view to helping you critically reflect on the contemporary

world, and make the connections between New Testament theology and contemporary issues.

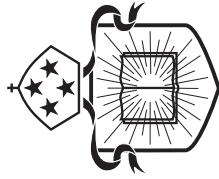
