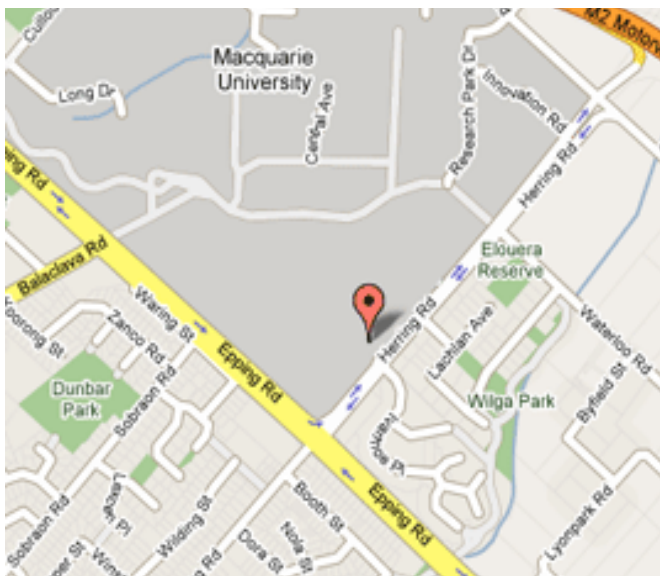

# Morling College Map



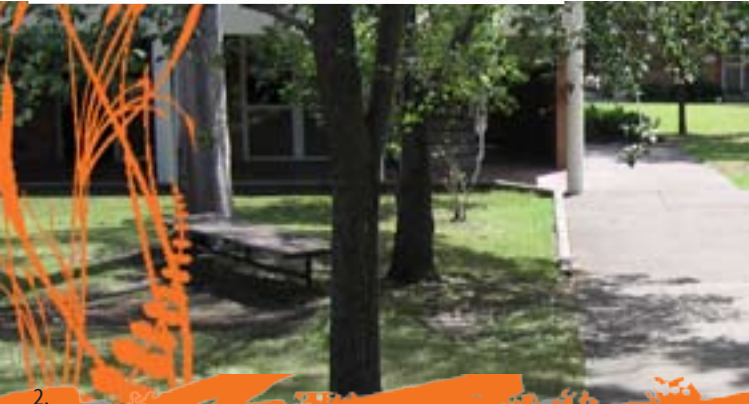

# Useful Extra Information

## Withdrawal/Variation Policy for 2009

Students may vary their subject selection or drop a subject without a Variation of Enrolment Fee until the Administration Date, and receive a full refund (or reversal of FEE-HELP).

Subject variations (addition or substitution of subjects) between the Administration Date and Census Date incur a fee of \$100 per subject added or substituted. A subject dropped receives a full refund (or FEE-HELP reversal) but incurs a \$300 administration fee. It is graded "AW" (Administrational Withdrawal) and receives no academic penalty.

Students should ensure that no substitutions or additions are made after Census Date. If a subject is dropped after the Census Date, there is no Variation of Enrolment Fee, but the students will not receive a refund nor a reversal of FEE-HELP debt incurred. The subject is graded "W" and receives no academic penalty.

Withdrawing from a subject after the Withdrawal Date receives no refund or FEE-HELP reversal and is penalised academically with a grade of "FW" (Fail Withdrawal). Refer to page 5 for key dates.

## Part-Time Study at Morling College

Part-time students at Morling study one or two subjects ("Units") per semester. Under approved special circumstances part-time students can study three subjects per semester. There are two semesters in a year and Units are usually one semester long. Each Unit typically requires one three-hour lecture per week during the thirteen teaching weeks of a semester. Units are usually studied towards a Degree or Diploma offered by the Australian College of Theology (ACT).

Part-time students are most welcome to enroll in day or evening classes, and be a part of College life. Community life is an important aspect of studying at Morling College and part-time students who attend day classes are welcome to be a part of weekly Chapel services, prayer triplets and common lunches. We also offer some courses and units by Distance Education, and it is possible to mix on-campus study and Distance Education.

All classes are held at Morling College's Herring Road campus in Macquarie Park.

## The Australian College of Theology (ACT)

The ACT is a national consortium of Theological Colleges which is an authorized Higher Education provider. Morling College is accredited by the Australian Dept. of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR) as an approved teaching institution of the ACT.



## Morning after six

Part-time students who attend evening classes will enjoy *Morning after six*, a community-building initiative for those who can not participate in daytime events at College. Together with full-time students attending evening classes, part-time students will have the opportunity to get to know one other and the Morling faculty through a common lecture break. While enjoying a cup of coffee or tea and a snack in the quadrangle, students will be able to partner with others in fellowship and prayer.

## How to Enrol (Part-Time)

You must fill out the Part-Time On-Campus Enrolment Form, available from: [http://www.morling.nsw.edu.au/morling\\_college/enrolling\\_to\\_study/enrolment\\_forms/](http://www.morling.nsw.edu.au/morling_college/enrolling_to_study/enrolment_forms/) or call the Registrar (02 9878 0201) or use the forms found in this booklet.

When you enroll in one of the ACT Awards (B.Th., B.Min., Dip.Min., etc.) you must enroll in both Morling College and the ACT, so the enrolment forms always include the ACT enrolment form; you must record your Unit choices on both forms. If you know you wish to enrol in one of the Morling College Internal Awards, then the ACT form is not necessary.

If English is not your first language, Morling College requires evidence of some tertiary study completed in English or your result in an IELTS test (academic).

## Supervised Experience-Based Learning

SEBL (Supervised Experienced-Based Learning) is a compulsory subject in the Advanced Diploma and Bachelor of Ministry Awards. It is equal to a full subject, but is broken into four quarters (one credit point per semester). New BMin and AdvDipMin students should enrol in the first quarter of SEBL along with any other chosen subjects. The attached enrolment form has a special space for this. Students in other Awards may also do SEBL. There is more information in the *Supplement to the Prospectus* (available from the College upon request). The Subject/Unit Code for the first quarter is "PC\*49 A" where "\*" is "2" for Diploma level, "4" for Degree level and "6" for Graduate level. Write the correct number in the space provided on the enrolment form.

# Courses available for part-time study

## ACT-accredited courses

Morling College offers a variety of ACT-accredited courses and awards for part-time study including:

**CERTIFICATE IN THEOLOGY** (also offered in Cantonese): This course is designed for people who want to understand the Christian faith and its relevance for today. **DIPLOMA OF THEOLOGY AND DIPLOMA OF MINISTRY:** This course provides a foundation of understanding and skills relevant for Christian service.

**ADVANCED DIPLOMA OF MINISTRY:** This course is a further year of study to deepen the understanding and training gained through the Diploma of Theology or Ministry.

**BACHELOR OF THEOLOGY:** This course is intended to provide a thorough grounding in Biblical and theological studies.

**BACHELOR OF MINISTRY:** This course is intended to prepare men and women for Christian ministry in Australia and other cultures. A wide range of practical and pastoral subjects is offered to allow specialisation in an area of ministry.

**BACHELOR OF CHRISTIAN STUDIES:** This course integrates university studies with theological education to bring a Christian perspective to a secular discipline.

**GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN DIVINITY:** This course is intended for graduates in disciplines other than theology who wish to undertake Biblical theological and pastoral ministry studies.

**GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN CHRISTIAN STUDIES:** This course is designed for students who wish to relate their previous tertiary study and employment to their Christian faith.

**MASTER OF DIVINITY:** This course prepares men and women who already have a degree (in a discipline other than theology) for ministry in the church and community.

## Internal courses

Morling College offers some internal courses which are not ACT-accredited:

**CERTIFICATE IN BIBLICAL STUDIES** (Morling award): This is a one year program of study and is intended to provide personal enrichment and equipping for more effective service as a church member.

**CERTIFICATE IN CHILDREN'S MINISTRY** (Morling award): This course is designed to help equip Sunday School teachers, Scripture teachers, those involved in children's clubs and others interested in children's ministry.

**CERTIFICATE IN YOUTH MINISTRY** (Morling award): This course is designed to help equip youth leaders, Scripture teachers, those involved in para-church organisations and others interested in youth ministry.

## Counselling courses

Morling College offers a Graduate Certificate and a Graduate Diploma in Christian Counselling. These courses provide training for professional and pastoral counselling.
