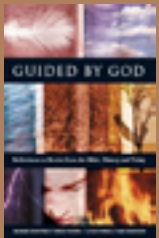


6. **Speaking of Mission: Eight scholars reimagine global mission for our time**

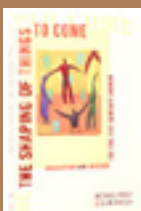


19. **Jesus the Fool**
